
BEGINNING GENEALOGY CLASSES OFFERED

LABELING DOCUMENTS FOR GENEALOGICAL PROOFS

Genealogy Tip By Mary Harrell-Sesniak "Genealogy is not just a pastime; it's a passion."



Genealogy societies generally require proof and source documents to be labeled – lest the application paperwork should become shuffled while reviewing. Many require your name, eligible ancestor, and details such as the chapter you wish to join, or generation of the ancestor. In the case of an early American proof, this can result in as many as 70-80 documents – as each ancestor's birth, marriage, death and connection to the next generation must be proved. Rather than label by hand, create labels.
